We envision a society where every individual regardless of their circumstances, has the opportunity to live a healthy, fulfilled, and dignified life free from poverty and suffering.




Mission:

MISSION 1.0

FREE MEDICAL OUTREACH AT UDUNG OKO

The outreach was flagged off by the chairman of the L.G.A, Hon Prince Atanang as well giving an opening remark. The Paramount ruler also gave an opening In addition, the Chief Executive Officer, Kampala Jnr foundation, Dr. Damian remarking.

Etetim Effiong in his opening remark welcomed everyone to the epoch making medical outreach. He advised everyone to remain calm and hopeful that the ailments with which they left their homes with will not return home with them.

He instructed everyone to abide by the instruction given by the team of medical personnel present to help in fast tracking the processes so everyone can live healthily, satisfied and sound.

Over 600 indigenes were attended to and several screening, test and investigations were attended to the glory of God. Hypertensive emergencies were attended to and referred and also malnourished children were attended to. All aforementioned screening tests were done and carried out with referrals where necessary such as tumor cases. General eye checkups done enabled the foundation to identify cases of cataract and age related macula densa and other ophthalmology cases were identified.

Also, Schizophrenic patients were identified by the psychiatric team and placed on treatment.



MISSION 2.0

UNIFORM A SCHOOL CHILD

The event took place at Ekeya Okobo L.G.A of Akwa Ibom State and was attended by community members, school officials, and representatives from partnering organizations.

The following outcomes were observed:

Successful Distribution: All 200 pupils receive their uniforms and sandals, which were well-received by both the children and their families.

Increased School Attendance:

Preliminary feedback from teachers indicated a noticeable increase in school attendance following the distribution.

Community Engagement: The event fostered a sense of community spirit, with many local residents expressing gratitude and support for future initiatives.

The donation of school uniforms and sandals to 200 pupils in rural Nigeria has made a significant impact on the community, promoting education and encouraging school attendance. This initiative demonstrates the importance of community support in addressing educational barriers and highlights the potential for future projects aimed at improving the lives of children in rural areas.



MISSION 3.0

BRIDGE TO SHELTER



The project is still in the proposal stage, awaiting funding and final approvals. Engagements with local authorities and stakeholders are ongoing to ensure community support.

A detailed plan, including architectural drawings, is under development.

PROJECTS 4.0

FREE MEDICAL OUTREACH AT EDEM IBIOK



The free medical outreach, sponsored by the Deputy Leader/ Councilor of Ibesikpo ward 5 in collaboration with the Kampala Jnr Humanitarian Foundation, was a community-centered health initiative aimed at providing essential medical services to residents of Ward 5. This initiative emphasized improving access to healthcare, promoting health awareness, and addressing common health challenges within the community.

Over 105 individuals benefited from eye checks, with 70 beneficiaries receiving glasses and medications.

Approximately 300 B.P. checks were conducted, with 7 individuals identified for follow-up on hypertension. 133 malaria tests were conducted, and treatment was provided to 68 confirmed cases, 208 individuals availed of HTS, with referrals of 7 made as required. TB screening covered 47 participants, and awareness sessions improved knowledge about the disease. 16 TBAs and midwives were sensitized, equipping them with improved skills and knowledge for maternal and neonatal care.

MISSION 4.0

FREE MEDICAL OUTREACH AT EDEM IBIOK

The free medical outreach was a resounding success, addressing critical health needs and raising awareness within Ibesikpo Ward 5. The initiative underscores the importance of collaborative efforts between political leaders and humanitarian organizations in promoting community health. We look forward to sustaining and expanding such programs to ensure a healthier and more informed community.
